In my free time, I enjoy reading, gardening, traveling and spending time in the lake with my family.

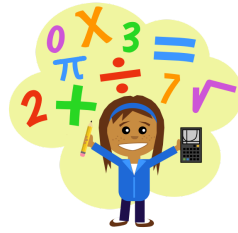

In my free time, I enjoy camping and hiking. I also enjoy reading and gardening.







