- A. <u>Call to Order</u>: Mark Lipscomb called the regular monthly meeting to order at 5:30 P.M. on August 5, 2019.
- **B.** <u>Establishment of Quorum/Roll Call</u>: Governors Richard Schmidt, Byron Lombard, Mark Lipscomb, Fatima Fields, David Mapp, and Kim Larkin were in attendance. Freddie Evans was absent. Also present were CEO Dr. Otho Tucker and CFO, Tim Hong.

- 3. Dr. Tucker reported that the learning cottage expansion unit is now complete and a certificate of occupancy has been issued.
- 4. Dr. Tucker reported that there are 294 children on the waiting list.
- **H.** <u>Annual Conflict of Interest Statements</u>: Richard Schmidt presented annual conflict of interest disclosure statements with copies of the applicable policies to the Board and discussed the policies.
- I. <u>Approval to Submit Application for Titan Academy:</u> Dr. Tucker presented the application for the K-8 State Charter Commission chartered school known as Titan Academy. The commission charter school, if approved, is to open as a K 3 and add one grade each year through eighth-grade.
