Lake Oconee Academy Board of Governors

Regular Monthly Meeting 5:30 PM, Monday, December 4, 2023

- **A.** <u>Call to Order:</u> Chairman Michael Tompkins called the regular monthly meeting to order at 5:30 P.M. on December 4, 2023. Michael Tompkins led the Pledge of Allegiance. The Meeting was held in the High School building.
- **B.** Establishment of Quorum/Roll Call: Governors, Michael Tompkins, Sarah Peacock, Kristina Jaskyte Bahr, Jennifer Vaughan, Kelly Brolly, and Richard Schmidt were in attendance. Also in attendance was Dr. Brad Bowling, Dr Otho Tucker, Perry Lee, Greene County Board of Education chair and Maggie Kjer, Greene County Board of Education member.
- C. <u>Approval of Monthly Meeting Minutes</u>: Jennifer Vaughan made a motion to approve the minutes from the November 6th, 2023, regular meeting. Motion seconded by Kelly Brolly. The motion carried unanimously.
- **D.** <u>Finance Report</u>: The financial reports for October and November were given by prestige. Sarah Peacock made a motion to approve the October 2023 financial reports as information. Seconded by Jennifer Vaughan. The motion carried unanimously. Sarah Peacock made a motion to approve the November 2023 financial reports as information. Seconded by Jennifer Vaughan. The motion carried unanimously.

E. Executive Director Report:

- 1. Dr. Bowling reported that the waiting list has 376 students, 30 of which are priority students.
- 2. Dr. Bowling discussed the September academic and athletic highlights, which are attached hereto.
- **F.** Action Item: Dr. Bowling went through the Greene County Board of Education's response to the charter petition. The Board of governors has agreed to waive its opposition to each of the unilateral amendments made by the Board of Education with one exception: the Board of Education insists that the funding cap (the number of which the Board of Education will pay for under the state funding formula and which is capped at 1144 students during the term of the charter) be the same as the number of students enrolled in the school. This creates a problem for LOA since the ability to grant a lottery priority to prospective teachers is a material benefit in attracting quality teachers. It is possible, in fact likely, that the statutory lottery priority would be precluded under the terms of the petition. LOA therefore has pressed to retain this ability but limit the number of additional students which can be enrolled in order to attract teachers. In addition, LOA has posed that it would not seek local funding, but in order to prevent improper payments to the Board of Education, LOA has requested that any state or federal portion of funds received for such students be paid to LOA. This allows LOA to continue to attract the best teachers, but at no additional cost over the funding cap to the Board of Education.

Jennifer Vaughan pointed out that under the Board of Education proposed language in the event any children were held back for academic or developmental reasons then matriculation of new students would have to be limited.

Following discussion by the Board Chairman Tompkins called for public comment. Todd Ciavola, commented that he believed the request was sound and prudent and would lobbying the Greene County Board of Education to agree to the change in the petition.

Following discussion, Richard Schmidt made a motion to approve the revised charter renewal petition to the School District as amended by the School District, but subject to the signing memorandum as follows: Lake Oconee Academy approve the charter as amended, but with a signing memorandum to be drafted and sent along with the petition to the State Board of Education which spelled out the issue with the flexibility in the enrollment cap for the purpose of using teacher lottery priorities to attract teachers, to waive any right to be funded for such students as matriculated over the funding cap provided however any state or federal funds would be payable to LOA.

The motion was seconded by Kelly Brolly. The motion carried unanimously.

Following the vote, general conversations between the Board and the audience were had.

G. <u>Adjournment:</u> There being no further business, Michael Tompkins made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Seconded by Kristina Jaskyte Bahr. The motion carried unanimously, and the meeting was adjourned.
