- **A.** Call to Order: Chairman Michael Tompkins called the regular monthly meeting to order at 5:30 P.M. on February 5, 2024. Michael Tompkins led the Pledge of Allegiance. The Meeting was held in the High School building.

- 2. Dr. Bowling reported that the waiting list has 376 students, there are 248 applications for the FY 24/25 school year, of which 53 are priority students.
- 3. Dr. Bowling discussed the September academic and athletic highlights, see attached.
- 4. Dr. Bowling gave a charter renewal update. The interview with the State Department of Education will be a zoom call on March 13, 2024.
- 5. Dr. Bowling gave an updated explanation of the Cognia rating, LOA received a score of 321 of 400, sufficient to put LOA in the top performing schools in Georgia.
- 6. Dr. Bowling gave a follow-up presentation of the CCRPI scores. The scores show that LOA is significantly above the state average, is at the high and of all schools in the state.
- **G. Public Comment.** Todd Ciavola congratulated the Board on the high scores and the accreditation. He also praised the Board's commitment to complete a Strategic Plan.
